Task 1 - Research

1) Firstly, research how members of the public are selected to be part of a jury in England and Wales and explain their role in a Crown Court trial.

This must include:

- How a juror is selected
- The requirements for jury service and who is disqualified
- What happens once jurors arrive at court
- Their role in deciding the verdict and what happens in the privacy of the jury room

2) Secondly, research articles that discuss whether the jury system should still be used in the criminal justice system. For this you will need to focus on the advantages and disadvantages of using a jury to decide a person's guilt or innocence.

You must not copy directly from Wikipedia or any other websites you use for research. You should produce a bibliography (list of books, journals, websites etc.) that you have used for your research at the end of your document.

6. How long does jury service normally last?
7. What is a jury's main role in a criminal trial?
8. Explain the meaning of a unanimous decision.
9. Explain the meaning of majority verdict.
10. What do jurors have to be careful of when they are making their decision?
