OVERVIEW OF SUBJECT

Film Studies A-Level explores how the language of film has an impact on our responses, and how understanding a film's production journey enhances the way we think about the film itself. By studying film, you will develop your critical thinking and enrich your understanding of how films are bound to their social, cultural and historical contexts and how filmmakers from a range of backgrounds represent these features through engaging and inspiring artistic choices. You will study films from America, Europe and beyond, and investigate how developments in filmmaking have affected our experiences of film viewing.

ENTRY CRITERIA

A minimum GCSE average of 5.3 and grade 4 in GCSE English Language.
