I expect about 100 words weekly. I will expect a thorough description of your activities where you will show me your written skills by being able **to use tenses accurately** as well as **specific vocabulary**.

Feel free **to describe** what you do but I expect **comments/opinions/analysis** on places you might visit, films/books you might watch/read. The idea is that you keep on practising your French throughout the summer to be ready for September. To do well for your French A level, it is important that you show an interest in the country and its culture.
