Summer Bridging Work is an important part of your transition to Wilberforce Sixth Form College. This piece of work will count towards your effort grade. Please complete your summer bridging work in time for the start of term.

You are required to bring evidence in paper format and hand this into your subject teacher during your first lesson.

A level Textiles/Fashion

OVERVIEW OF SUBJECT. This course will enable you to learn and develop a broad range of skills during the first term which includes the following: -

Fashion design, construction, and illustration

Interior design, surface pattern and printed textiles.

Fine art Textiles, embroidery, and applique.

Students choose their preferred specialist area during the 2nd term and produce work responding to their own chosen theme. This means that students are more engaged and enjoy the course as it appeals to their interests. This course is for you if you are considering an art-related degree/career, or if you want to broaden your creative skills whilst doing something you love.

ENTRY CRITERIA. You must have a minimum of five GCSEs at grades 9-4, including a grade 4 in English Language. It is preferable that you have a Level 2 qualification in an art-based subject (e.g., a Merit at BTEC or a grade 4 at GCSE). If you don't, you will need to bring a portfolio of work to your interview which we will review during enrolment.

LITERACY TASK

Research the work of **two** Fashion or Textile designers who you find inspiring. Write 250 words of background research on each designer and comment on the aspects you find inspiring about their work (include images to illustrate your points).
